New trailer for Cadets

MEMBERS of the Cootamundra 256 Army Cadet Unit have fundraised to purchase a new trailer, which will be used for field training exercises and camps.

The \$7000 trailer was designed built by the inmates at the Junee Correctional Centre.

The trailer features an in built barbecue, plenty of storage space; stainless steel workbenches accredited for food safety hygiene and are all fully lockable. Before the trailer was purchased, cadets used to take

their own barbecue and tables and transported all their required gear in vehicles.

Cootamundra Cadets Major Jacqui Vincent said this versatile trailer would make things easier during field training events and camps.

Major Vincent said the cadets were able to fundraise for the trailer through proceeds made from raffles; a chocolate drive over recent years and providing the barbecue at community events like last year's

Cootamundra Public School Fete.

John Philpott, industry supervisor from the Junee Correctional Centre who supervised with the designing and construction of the trailer was recently in Cootamundra to present the 256 Army Cadet Unit with their new trailer.

The trailer was used for the first time last weekend where the Cadets took part in field training exercises at Futter Park.
