

Top two rewarded for great results

JUNEE High School's leading students from 2012 have been rewarded for their hard work with the GEO Bressington Scholarships.

The scholarship, worth up to \$1500 is awarded to the highest scoring students in the Higher School Certificate (HSC) who then go on to further education.

Megan Puttock and Aiden Harrison received the best results from among the students

during last year's HSC.

Miss Puttock will study nursing at Charles Sturt University while Mr Harrison head to the University of Southern Queensland to study psychology.

"The scholarship recognises success and students working as hard as they can but also the ongoing importance of continuing learning," Junee High School principal Matthew Brown said. Mr Brown said the

scholarship was a just reward for students who put in the effort in their studies.
