## *Bloomin' digging it*

**WITH the help of inmates from Junee Correctional Centre, resident Brian Higginson is working to give Junee a green touch.**

Mr Higginson has planted agapanthus from the corner of Belmore and Lorne streets – stretching past the court house, police station, community centre and CWA halls.

An ongoing project for Mr Higginson, the plants, which flower in

summer, can also be found in Lisgar St.

As part of their community service, inmates have cleared gardens by the footpath outside Junee Public School in preparation for more agapanthus plantings.

However, Mr Higginson needs more help as he has only 150 agapanthus and he estimates the job will need at least another 600 plants.

He is hoping the community of

Junee will be able to donate a plant or two.

“Any help would be greatly appreciated,” Mr Higginson said.

A former president of the Tidy Towns committee, Mr Higginson began by planting agapanthus outside his home a decade ago and it hasn't stopped.

The picket fences for the court house, police station and community centre were made at Junee

Correctional Centre and installed by Mr Higginson.

“Without the help of the correctional centre and inmates, it wouldn't be possible,” he said.

“The shire (council) has also helped, without their blessing, none of this would have happened.”
